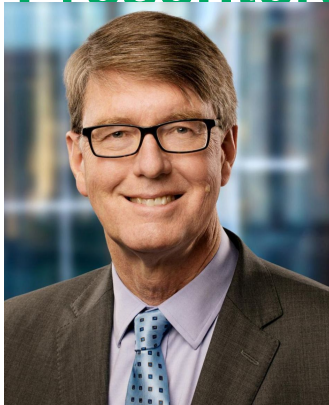
Bank of Canada Deputy Governor **Tim Lane** will take stock of how
